Your Committee on Ways and Means to which was referred:

**House Bill No. 24-91:** “To appropriate \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected by the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund infrastructure projects in the First Senatorial District.”

**I. RECOMMENDATION:**

After considerable discussion, your Committee recommends that House Bill No. 24-91 be passed by the House in the form of House Substitute 1 (HS1).

## **II. ANALYSIS:**

### **A. Purpose:**

The purpose of this Act is to appropriate \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected by the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund infrastructure projects in the First Senatorial District.

### **B. Committee Amendments:**

The Committee made the following amendments to strengthen the intent of this Act. The Committee deleted the word “infrastructure” when referring to projects in the First Senatorial District. These amendments will allow the municipality flexibility when expending these funds and allow them to prioritize funding where urgently needed.

### **C. Committee Findings:**

Your Committee finds that the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) has identified funds from dividends collected by CEDA from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation that is available for appropriation.

Your Committee finds that this Act will appropriate \$300,000.00 from the dividends collected by the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation to fund projects in the First Senatorial District. The Rota Legislative Delegation will adopt a resolution to allocate funds for projects within the municipality. The Mayor of Rota shall have the authority to expend the allocated funds. To ensure transparency in the expenditure of said funds, the Mayor of Rota shall be responsible for reporting all expenses to the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority upon the exhaustion of the funds appropriated under this Act.

Your Committee is cognizant that the First Senatorial District requires additional funding to improve and maintain projects within its municipality. This dedicated fund will ensure resources are specifically allocated to support, improve and maintain projects and other urgent needs within the municipality, promoting sustainable management. After thorough consideration and discussion, your Committee recommends that House Bill No. 24-91, as amended and reflected in HS1, be passed by the House to provide much needed funding and support the ongoing work of the Mayor of Rota.

D. Public Comments/Public Hearing:

In a public meeting held on March 10, 2026, the Committee did not receive oral testimonies during public comments for House Bill No. 24-91.

E. Legislative History:

House Bill No. 24-91 was introduced by Representative Julie Marie A. Ogo on February 9, 2026 and was subsequently referred to the House Standing Committee on Ways and Means for disposition.


F. Cost Benefit:


The enactment of House Bill No. 24-91, HS1, will not impose additional costs on the CNMI Government. The Act appropriates \$300,000.00, that has been identified by CEDA for appropriation, that will be expended for projects in the First Senatorial District.

The Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of House Bill No. 24-91 and recommends its passage in the form of House Bill No. 24-91, House Substitute 1.





**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

To appropriate \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected by the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund infrastructure projects in the First Senatorial District.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE 24<sup>TH</sup> NORTHERN MARIANAS  
COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:**

1           **Section 1. Findings and Purpose.**

2           The Legislature finds that the First Senatorial District requires additional  
3 funding to improve and maintain its public infrastructure.

4           Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate dividends collected by  
5 the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the  
6 Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund infrastructure projects within  
7 the First Senatorial District.

8           **Section 2. Appropriation and Project Approval.**

9           “Notwithstanding any provision(s) of law, statutes, rules, or regulations to the  
10 contrary and pursuant to 4 CMC § 10508, \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected  
11 by CEDA from CUC is appropriated to fund infrastructure projects in the First

1 Senatorial District. The Rota Legislative Delegation shall adopt a resolution to  
2 distribute funds for particular infrastructure projects in the municipality.”

3 **Section 3. No Fiscal Year Limitation.**

4 The funds appropriated under this Act shall be without fiscal year limitation.

5 **Section 4. Expenditure Authority.**

6 The expenditure authority of the funds under this Act shall be the Mayor of  
7 the Municipality of Rota.

8 **Section 5. Severability.** If any provisions of this Act or the application of  
9 any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court  
10 of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its  
11 provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid  
12 shall not be affected thereby.


13 **Section 6. Savings Clause.** This Act and any repealer contained herein shall  
14 not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired  
15 under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation, or order adopted under the  
16 statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted  
17 under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect  
18 of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall  
19 already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

20 **Section 7. Effective Date.** This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the  
21 Governor, or it becoming law without such approval.



**BE IT ENACTED BY THE 24<sup>TH</sup> NORTHERN MARIANAS  
COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:**

1           **Section 1. Findings and Purpose.** The Legislature finds that the First  
2 Senatorial District requires additional funding to improve and maintain projects in  
3 the First Senatorial District.

4           Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate dividends collected by the  
5 Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the  
6 Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund projects within the First  
7 Senatorial District.

8           **Section 2. Appropriation and Project Approval.** “Notwithstanding any  
9 provision(s) of law, statutes, rules, or regulations to the contrary and pursuant to 4  
10 CMC § 10508, \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected by CEDA from CUC for

1 projects in the First Senatorial District. The Rota Legislative Delegation shall adopt  
2 a resolution to distribute funds for projects in the municipality.”

3       **Section 3. No Fiscal Year Limitation.** The funds appropriated under this  
4 Act shall be without fiscal year limitation.

5       **Section 4. Expenditure Authority.** The expenditure authority of the funds  
6 under this Act shall be the Mayor of the Municipality of Rota.

7       **Section 5. Severability.** If any provisions of this Act or the application of  
8 any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court  
9 of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its  
10 provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid  
11 shall not be affected thereby.

12       **Section 6. Savings Clause.** This Act and any repealer contained herein shall
