Your Committee on Ways and Means to which was referred:

House Bill No. 24-89: “To appropriate \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected by the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund infrastructure projects in the Second Senatorial District.”

begs leave to report as follows:

I. RECOMMENDATION:

After considerable discussion, your Committee recommends that House Bill No. 24-89 be passed by the House in the form of House Substitute 1 (HS1).

II. ANALYSIS:

A. Purpose:

The purpose of this Act is to appropriate \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected by the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund infrastructure projects in the Second Senatorial District.

B. Committee Amendments:

The Committee made the following amendments to strengthen the intent of this Act. The Committee deleted the word “infrastructure” when referring to projects in the Second Senatorial District and inserted new language that would authorize the Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative Delegation to adopt a resolution to distribute the funds for projects within the municipality. These amendments will allow the municipality flexibility when expending these funds and allow them to prioritize funding where urgently needed.

C. Committee Findings:

Your Committee finds that the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) has identified funds from dividends collected by CEDA from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation that is available for appropriation.

Your Committee finds that this Act will appropriate \$300,000.00 from the dividends collected by the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation to fund projects in the Second Senatorial District. The Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative Delegation will adopt a resolution to allocate funds for projects within the municipality. The Mayor of Tinian shall have the authority to expend the allocated funds. To ensure transparency in the expenditure of said funds, the Mayor of Tinian shall be responsible for reporting all expenses to the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority upon the exhaustion of the funds appropriated under this Act.

Your Committee is cognizant that the Second Senatorial District requires additional funding to improve and maintain projects within its municipality. This dedicated fund will ensure resources are specifically allocated to support, improve and maintain projects and other urgent needs within the municipality, promoting sustainable management. After thorough consideration and discussion, your Committee recommends that House Bill No. 24-89, as amended and reflected in HS1, be passed by the House to provide much needed funding and support the ongoing work of the Mayor of Tinian.

D. Public Comments/Public Hearing:

In a public meeting held on March 10, 2026, the Committee did not receive oral testimonies during public comments for House Bill No. 24-89.

E. Legislative History:

House Bill No. 24-89 was introduced by Representative Patrick H. San Nicolas on February 9, 2026 and was subsequently referred to the House Standing Committee on Ways and Means for disposition.


F. Cost Benefit:

The enactment of House Bill No. 24-84, HS1, will not impose additional costs on the CNMI Government. The Act appropriates \$300,000.00, that has been identified by CEDA for appropriation, that will be expended for projects in the Second Senatorial District.

III. CONCLUSION:

The Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of House Bill No. 24-89 and recommends its passage in the form of House Bill No. 24-89, House Substitute 1.

H. B. 24-89

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected by the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund infrastructure projects in the Second Senatorial District.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE 24TH NORTHERN MARIANAS
COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:**

1 **Section 1.** The Legislature finds that the Second Senatorial District requires
2 additional funding to improve and maintain its public infrastructure.

3 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate dividends collected by
4 the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the
5 Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund infrastructure projects within
6 the Second Senatorial District.

7 **SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.**

8 Notwithstanding any provision(s) of law, statutes, rules or regulations to the
9 contrary and pursuant to 4 CMC § 10508 to appropriate dividends collected by
10 CEDA from CUC, the Legislature hereby appropriates \$300,000.00 of the

1 dividends collected by CEDA from CUC to fund infrastructure projects in the
2 Second Senatorial District.

3 **SECTION 3. REPROGRAMMING.**

4 Funds appropriated under this act may be reprogrammed for any other
5 purpose, and notwithstanding any provision of law, all funds appropriated under
6 this Act shall be without fiscal year limitation.

7 **SECTION 4. EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY.**

8 The expenditure authority of the funds allocated under Section 2 of this Act
9 shall be the Mayor of Tinian. Furthermore, the Mayor of Tinian shall be
10 responsible for reporting all expenses to the Commonwealth Economic
11 Development Authority upon the exhaustion of the funds appropriated under this
12 Act.

13 **SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.**

14 If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any
15 person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction,
16 the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or
17 circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected
18 thereby.

19 **SECTION 6. SAVINGS CLAUSE.**

20 This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as
21 affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes

1 repealed or under any rule, regulation, or order adopted under the statutes.
2 Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or
3 pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect of
4 terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall
5 already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.


6 **SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

7 This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or it becoming
8 law without such approval.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected by the Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund projects in the Second Senatorial District.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE 24TH NORTHERN MARIANAS
COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:**

1 **Section 1. Findings and Purpose.** The Legislature finds that the Second
2 Senatorial District requires additional funding to improve and maintain projects in
3 the Second Senatorial District..

4 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate dividends collected by the
5 Commonwealth Economic Development Authority (CEDA) from the
6 Commonwealth Utilities Corporation (CUC) to fund projects within the Second
7 Senatorial District.

8 **Section 2. Appropriation.** “Notwithstanding any provision(s) of law,
9 statutes, rules or regulations to the contrary and pursuant to 4 CMC § 10508 to
10 appropriate dividends collected by CEDA from CUC, the Legislature hereby
11 appropriates \$300,000.00 of the dividends collected by CEDA from CUC for the

1 Second Senatorial District. The Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative Delegation shall
2 adopt a resolution to distribute funds for projects in the municipality.”

3 **Section 3. Reprogramming.** Funds appropriated under this act may be
4 reprogrammed for any other purpose, and notwithstanding any provision of law, all
5 funds appropriated under this Act shall be without fiscal year limitation.

6 **Section 4. Expenditure Authority.** The expenditure authority of the funds
7 allocated under Section 2 of this Act shall be the Mayor of Tinian. Furthermore,
8 the Mayor of Tinian shall be responsible for reporting all expenses to the
9 Commonwealth Economic Development Authority upon the exhaustion of the
10 funds appropriated under this Act.

11 **Section 5. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or the application of any
12 such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of
13 competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions
14 to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be
15 affected thereby.

16 **Section 6. Savings Clause.** This Act and any repealer contained herein shall
17 not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired
18 under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation, or order adopted under the
19 statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted
20 under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect
21 of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall

1 already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

2 **Section 7. Effective Date.** This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the
3 Governor or it becoming law without such approval.
