A SENATE RESOLUTION

To honor the distinguished service of Chief Warrant Officer Four Rosannie Castro McGee upon her retirement from the United States Army, and to commend her exemplary leadership, unwavering, and outstanding contributions to the defense of our nation.

1 **WHEREAS**, this Legislative Body is proud to recognize and honor the sons and
2 daughters of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands who have answered the
3 call to serve in the United States Armed Forces with courage, commitment, and distinction,
4 protecting our nation’s security, and proudly representing our island community; and

5 **WHEREAS**, Chief Warrant Officer Four (CW4) (Ret.) Rosannie Castro McGee
6 was born and raised on the beautiful island of Saipan to proud parents Joseph M. Castro
7 and Julita Castro. Alongside her siblings—Amy T. Castro, Gregorie Ike C. Castro, Dolorie
8 Lynn C. Rawley, Joeline C. Castro, Remedio C. Castro, and Joseph C. Castro—she was
9 instilled with the values of respect, hard work, and a deep sense of service; and

10 **WHEREAS**, CW4 (Ret.) McGee began her education at Mount Carmel School
11 from 1985-1995, before relocating to Washington state, where she graduated from
12 Spanaway Lake High School in 1998. She continued her education at Pierce College, from
13 1999-2000, after which she made the selfless decision to pursue a military career; and

14 **WHEREAS**, after Quartermaster training in 1998, CW4 (Ret.) McGee served as a
15 unit supply specialist with the 380th CONUS Replacement Center Battalion and 959th
16 Replacement Company; and

17 **WHEREAS**, in 2003, CW4 (Ret.) McGee supported Operation Enduring Freedom
18 at Fort Bliss, Texas, facilitating logistical coordination between the military and UNICOR;
19 and

1 **WHEREAS**, as the S4 NCOIC of the 476th Chemical Battalion in 2005, CW4
2 (Ret.) McGee managed forecasting and equipment accountability during deployment and
3 redeployment operations for units within the battalion as a Staff Sergeant; and

4 **WHEREAS**, promoted to the rank of Sergeant First Class in 2008, CW4 (Ret.)
5 McGee became an instructor at the Army Readiness Training Academy, developing
6 training for the Army's first web-based logistics system; and

7 **WHEREAS**, later that same year, CW4 (Ret.) McGee attended Warrant Officer
8 Candidate School and subsequently served as Property Book Officer for both the 483rd
9 and 385th Transportation Battalions (TC BN), overseeing integrated logistics and
10 maintaining 100% accountability of equipment; and

11 **WHEREAS** CW4 (Ret.) McGee maintained comprehensive property
12 accountability initiatives and oversaw equipment modernization programs while serving
13 with the 961st Engineer Battalion in 2013 and the 450th TC BN in 2015; and

14 **WHEREAS**, during her assignment with the 654th Regional Support Group in
15 2017, CW4 (Ret.) McGee played a key role in implementing the Army's second web-based
16 logistics and fiscal management application. This initiative advanced the Army Chief
17 Information Officer modernization goals and supported the objectives of the Identity,
18 Credential and Access Management program; and

19 **WHEREAS**, from 2020 until her retirement in 2025, CW4 (Ret.) McGee continued
20 to support the Army's mission by training and mentoring unit commanders within the 457th
21 TC BN to strengthen property accountability and supply readiness; and

22 **WHEREAS**, CW4 (Ret.) McGee's extensive military education includes Primary
23 Leadership Development Course (2001), Basic Non-Commission Officer Course (2005),
24 Battle Staff Non-Commission Officer (2006), Army Basic Instructor Course (2008),
25 Warrant Officer Candidate School (2008), Warrant Officer Basic Course (2009), Property
26 Accounting Technician Warrant Officer Advance Course (2015), and the Quartermaster
27 Warrant Officer Intermediate Level Education Follow-on Course (2020); and

28 **WHEREAS**, CW4 (Ret.) McGee's exemplary service has been recognized with
29 numerous awards, including the Meritorious Service Medal (four awards), Army

1 Commendation Medal (six awards), Army Achievement Medal (seven awards), Army
2 Reserve Components Achievement Medal (two awards), National Defense Service Medal,
3 Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal with Silver
4 Hourglass and Meritorious Device, and the National Defense Industrial Association
5 Award; and

6 **WHEREAS**, with her many accomplishments and accolades, CW4 (Ret.) McGee
7 has remained humble and grounded to her island roots as she continues to serve her
8 community, working with the Chanhassen Bluff Creek Elementary Schol and the Chaska
9 Community Center in Minnesota. She is married to her life companion, MSG (Ret.) George
10 Andrew McGee of Charleston, West Virginia, and together they have built a beautiful life
11 with cherished memories with their three children: Jazmyn, Rose, and Drew; and

12 **WHEREAS**, CW4 (Ret.) McGee’s extraordinary military career has left a lasting
13 legacy of service, professionalism, and integrity, inspiring the next generation of military
14 personnel from the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands;

15 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Senate of the Twenty-Fourth
16 Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature hereby joins the people of the
17 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands in honoring and commending Chief
18 Warrant Officer Four (Ret.) Rosannie Castro McGee for her exceptional service to our
19 nation and for the honor she has brought to the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana
20 Islands; and

21 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Senate extends its deepest gratitude to
22 Chief Warrant Officer Four (Ret.) Rosannie Castro McGee for her sacrifices and
23 contributions, and offers their best wishes her continued success and fulfillment in the next
24 chapter of her life;

25 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the President of the Senate shall certify, and
26 the Senate Legislative Secretary shall attest to the adoption of this resolution and thereafter
27 the Senate Clerk shall transmit a certified copy to Chief Warrant Officer Four (Ret.)
28 Rosannie Castro McGee; the Honorable David M. Apatang, Governor of the
29 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands; the Honorable Edmund S. Villagomez,

1 Speaker of the House of Representatives, Twenty-Fourth Northern Marianas
2 Commonwealth Legislature; and the Honorable Kimberlyn King-Hinds, CNMI Delegate
3 to the House of Representatives, 119th United States Congress.
