16	allowed in college admissions defended their opinion as to why it's fair for colleges

2	position as to why the college admissions policies should not continue to allow
3	affirmative action in higher education; and
4	WHEREAS, the students who participated in the 32 nd Attorney General'
5	Cup Speech Competition exhibited thorough arguments in defense of their position
6	regarding affirmative action within college admissions; and
7	WHEREAS, the long hours of research, countless drafts, and daily practice
8	of the students in preparation for the deliverance of their speeches resulted in th
9	selection of three students as the overall winners of the 32 nd Attorney General'
10	Cup Speech Competition, in which first place honors went to Ms. Jill Anne Mallar

13	and deliverance, Mount Carmel School attained its twentieth victory in the Attorne
